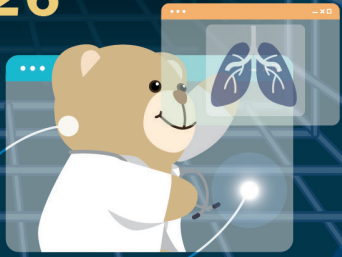
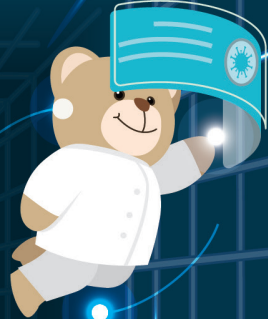

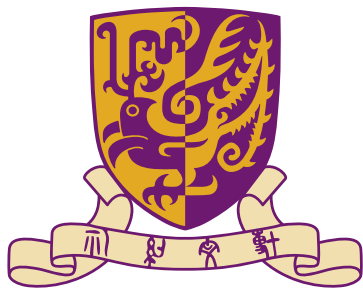

green symbolizes youth and vigour. Mimicking the leaf veins, the Chinese characters of *CUHK* (中大) are embossed on the apricot leaf.



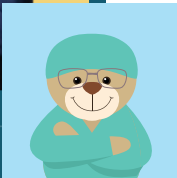

Humanitarian Work

Mr. LEUNG Pak Ho Adrian (MBChB-GPS Yr6)

Adrian participated in a Cataract Blindness Elimination project organised by CCOUC and GX Foundation in Pakse, Laos. The program required students to perform pre-operative health checks and health education for patients requiring cataract surgery. Through collaboration with different government bodies, enterprises, and medical staff, the project efficiently restored the vision of the underprivileged. The trip offered a valuable opportunity for participants to immerse themselves in a culture and healthcare system different from Hong Kong. They were also able to appreciate the aspects considered and the organization required to deliver an effective health intervention.



Ms. WAN Che Ching Chloe (MBChB-GPS Yr 2)

Natural geographical factors play a profound role in affecting one's physical wellbeing. People in the sub-Saharan African region are prone to developing cataracts as young as 25 years old - just a few years older myself. Fatick, a suburban city in Senegal, relies on merely 2 ophthalmologists to support an overwhelming number of patients affected by ophthalmic complications. This is a stark reminder of the disparities in healthcare access and outcomes across the globe. Chloe had the opportunity to learn from international medical volunteers from the GX Foundation while simultaneously conducting on-site research for the medical community to learn about the local knowledge, perceptions, and actions taken towards the malaria endemic in Senegal. This experience speaks to the wealth of human capital and the potential that can be unlocked through collaborative efforts between nations, breaking down barriers and fostering mutual understanding.

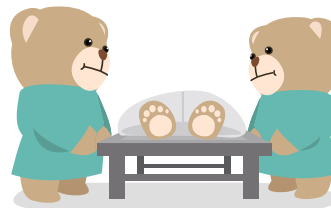
The BMSB is a dedicated teaching and learning complex for the undergraduate students of the Faculty of Medicine.

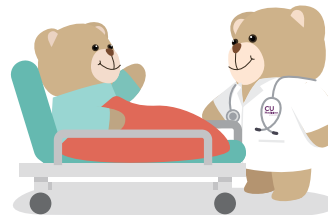

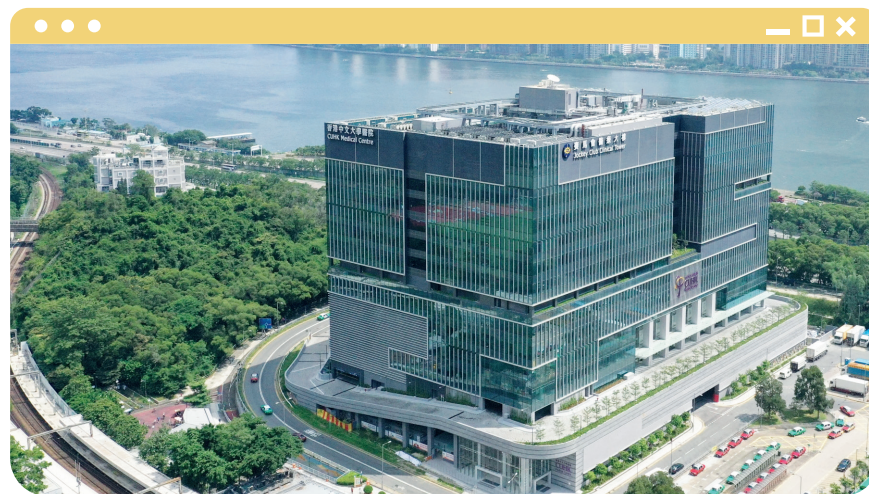
The Phase II redevelopment project commenced in 2017 will provide additional space to meet the increasing service demand and operational needs.

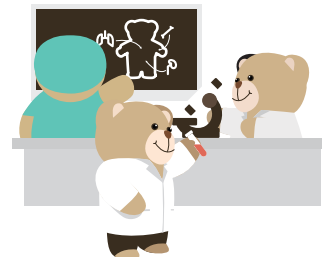
Li Ka Shing Specialist Outpatient Clinics (North Wing), Prince of Wales Hospital

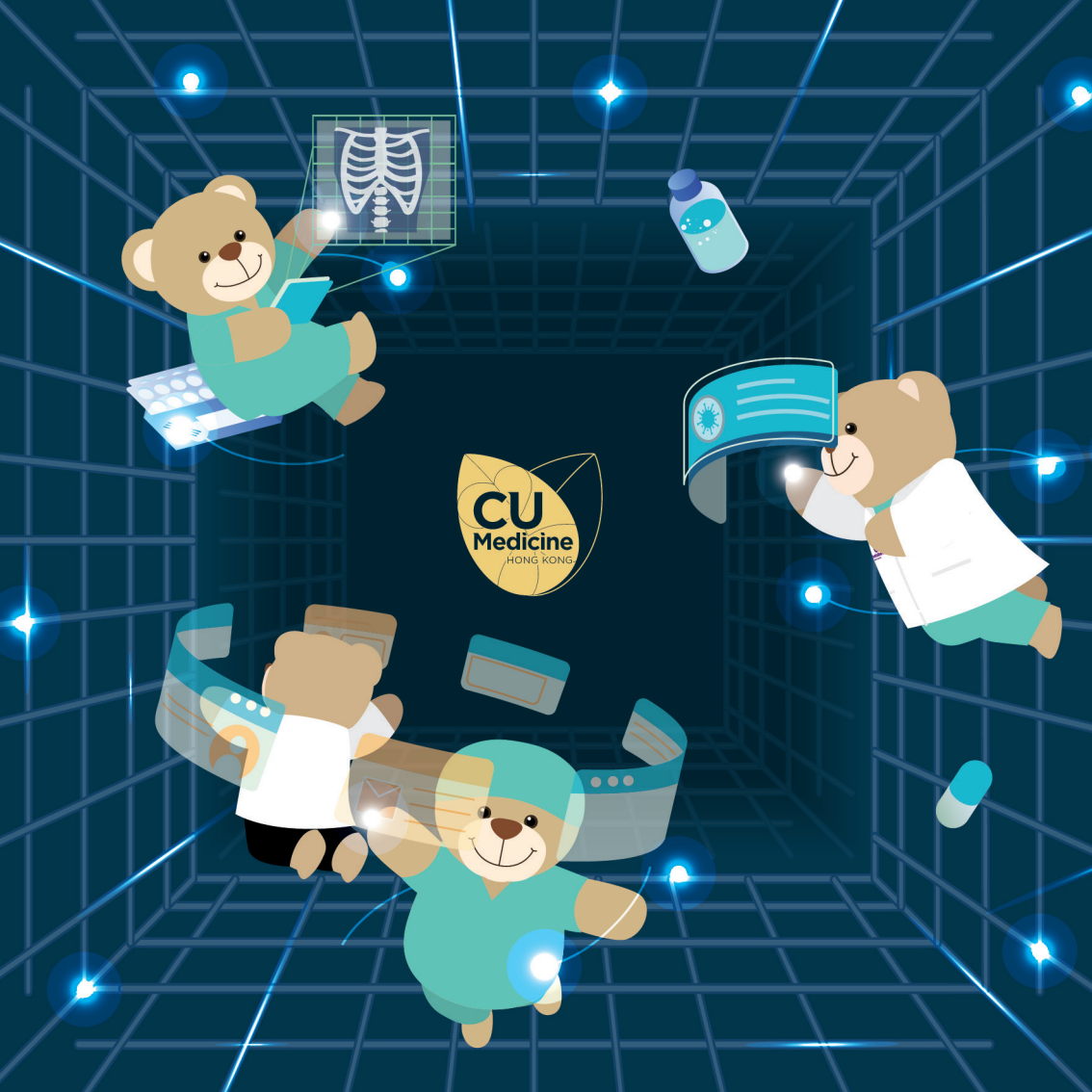
